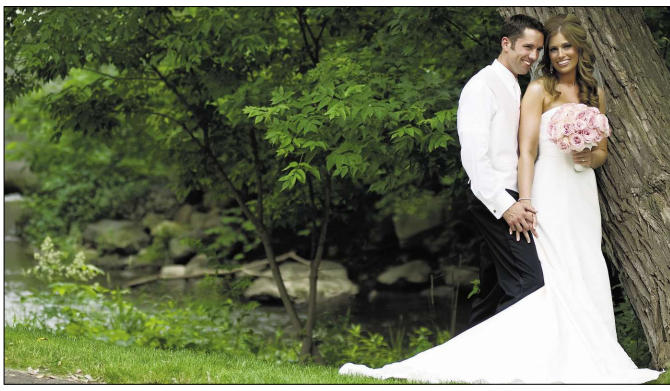


Murphy & Resnik
